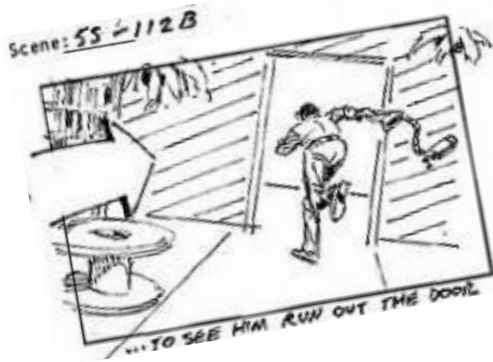

# Storyboards

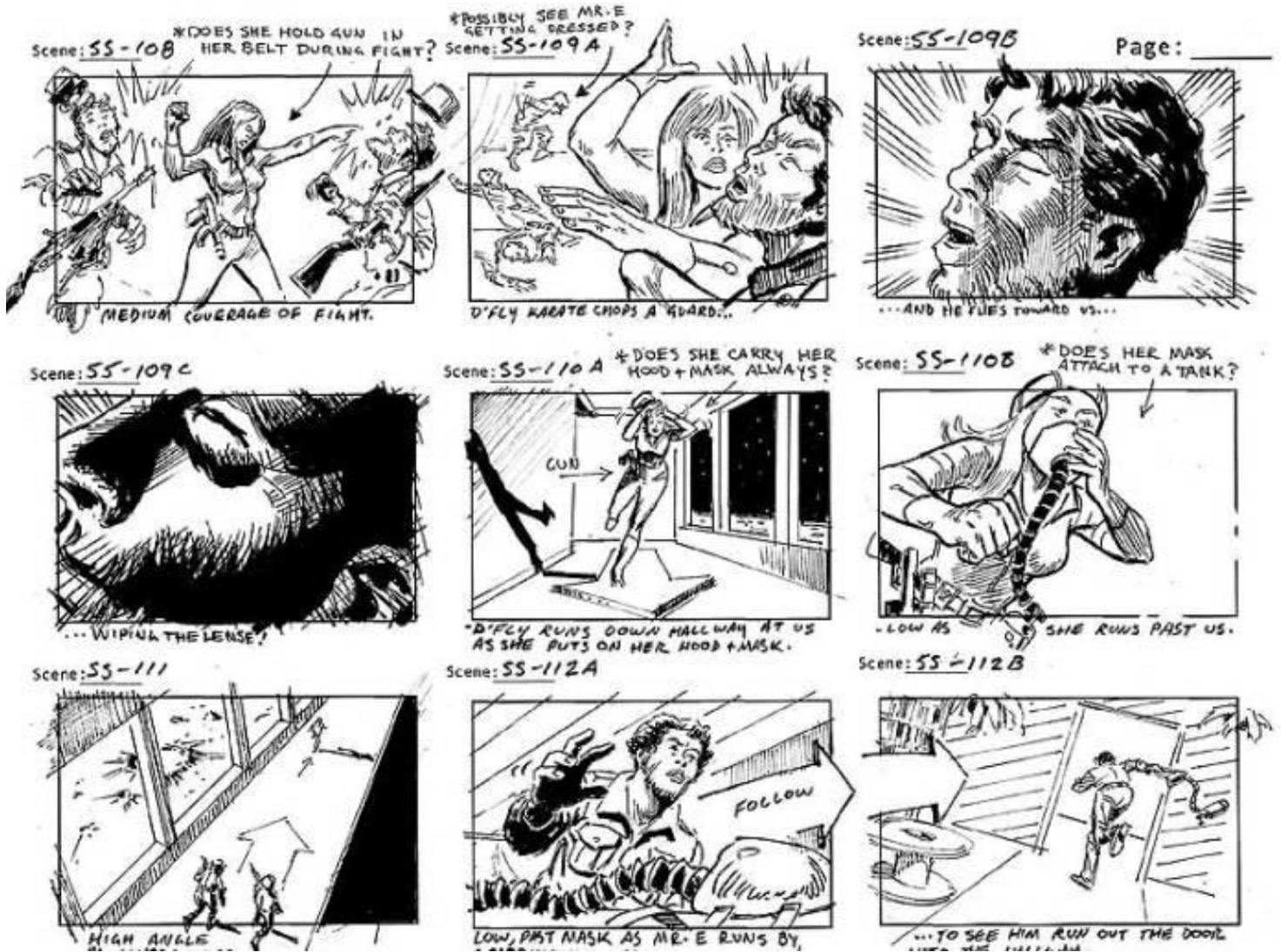

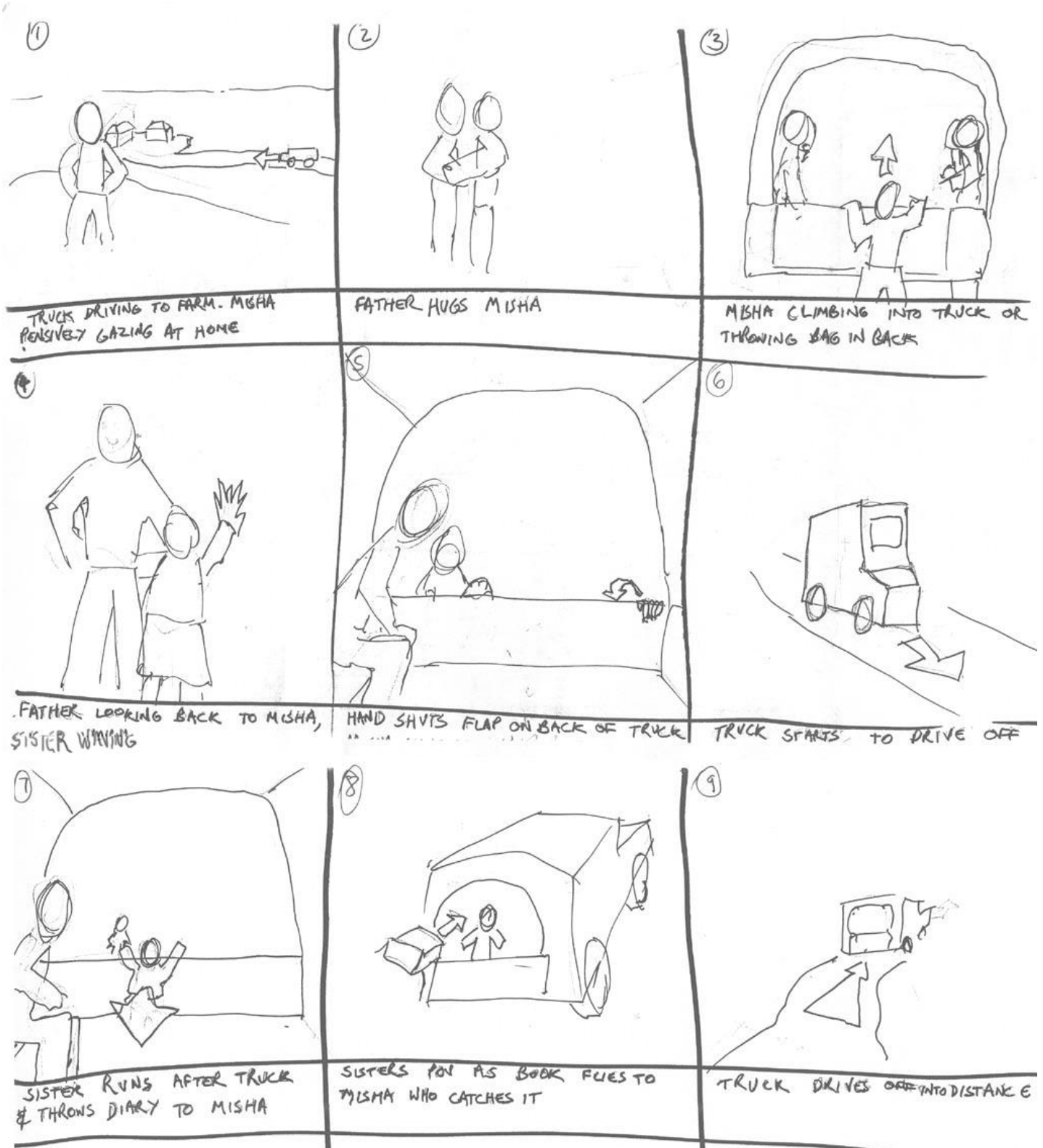
