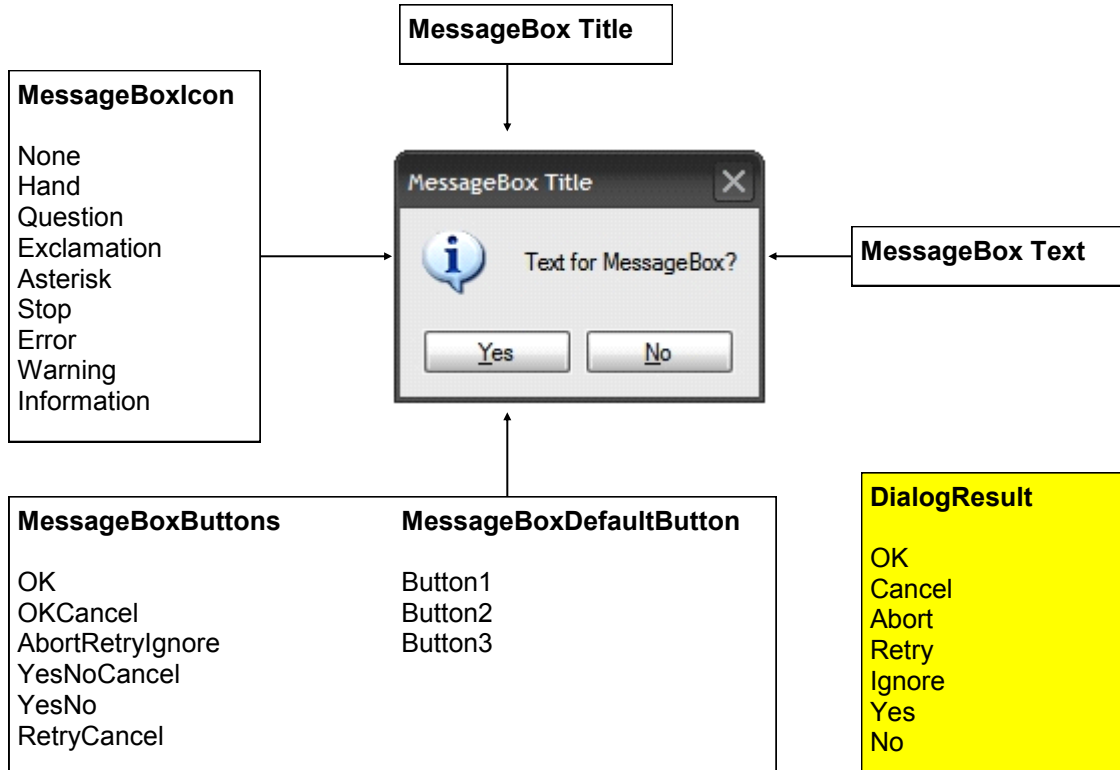

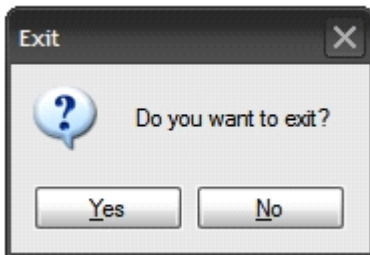

MessageBox Examples

The "Exit" MessageBox

```
Dim response As Integer  
response = MessageBox.Show("Do you want to exit?", "Exit", MessageBoxButtons.YesNo, MessageBoxIcon.Question)  
If response = DialogResult.Yes Then Me.Close()
```



The "About" MessageBox

```
Dim messagetext As String  
messagetext = "My Program" + vbNewLine  
messagetext = messagetext + "Version 1.0" + vbNewLine  
messagetext = messagetext + "August 1, 2009" + vbNewLine + vbNewLine  
messagetext = messagetext + "by (your name)" + vbNewLine  
messagetext = messagetext + "Computer Science" + vbNewLine  
messagetext = messagetext + "Mr. Giansante" + vbNewLine  
messagetext = messagetext + "Lincoln High School" + vbNewLine  
messagetext = messagetext + "Buenos Aires, Argentina" + vbNewLine  
MessageBox.Show(messagetext, "About", MessageBoxButtons.OK, MessageBoxIcon.Information)
```
