SPREADS

NOTABLE FEATURES

EACH SPREAD THAT YOU SEE IN THE 2018 *LOOK BOOK* IS TAGGED WITH NOTABLE FEATURES THAT ARE ESPECIALLY WELL DONE ON THAT SPREAD. THE *LOOK BOOK* JUDGES CONSIDERED THESE ITEMS AS SELECTION CRITERIA.



Alignment of Elements – Text and other design elements in a module or on a spread that are placed so their edges line up. Alignment helps to create order, organize elements, create visual connections and improve the readability of design.

Color – Color that has been incorporated into the design in a way that adds interest while simultaneously allowing the photographs to be the center of interest.

Coverage – Design that showcases many students and story angles through photos or quotes.

Cut-Out Photo – A photo in which the background has been removed, usually using Photoshop or another photo editing software.

Dominant Element – A key of good design. One element, usually a photo or a group of photos, is obviously larger and more eye-catching than all other elements on the page.

Folio – The page number and any graphics, photos or text associated with it.

Folio Content – Engaging or informational graphics, photos or text associated with the folio.

Folio Design – Thoughtfully designed folio content that adds to the look and feel of the spread and is reflective of theme graphics.

Fonts – A combination of fonts that reflect the theme of the yearbook, interact well and are readable.

Graphics – Lines or shapes thoughtfully, and usually subtly, used to enhance the design of a page so that photos remain the star of the show.

Headline Design – The combination of a primary headline and secondary headline that utilize font, color and placement to visually reflect theme and content.

Headline Writing – Rhyme, alliteration or a clever play on words used to create a primary headline that is more than an activity label like “volleyball,” and verbally reflects the content.

Lines – Thoughtful use of lines should separate or connect elements, or can be used as a graphic, but are not placed on the spread in a way that appears random or detracts from content.

Modules – Modules are used to tell the story of an event or topic, or an angle to the main story, in an inclusive way, but are separated from other content by white space or graphics so that the spread does not look cluttered.



Partial Cut-Out – A photo in which some of the background has been removed, usually using Photoshop or another photo editing software.

Photo Illustration – A photo that is used to visually define an idea. Photo illustrations are often photos that have been electronically enhanced or posed.

Photo Package – A grouping of photos on a specific and focused topic, often with tight internal spacing.

Photo Strip – A linear configuration of photos running vertically or horizontally across a page or spread.

Pica – 1/6 of an inch.

Quick Read Content or Topic – Easily digestible content provided in a format that only takes seconds to read. Quick reads help tell the story by focusing on essential facts, figures and quotes.

Quick Read Design – An attractive and purposeful use of type, shape, line or color that showcases the information in the quick read and enhances the spread overall.

Quotes – First person stories so intimate they could be said by only one person in the school community. Great quotes shed unique light on personalities, interests or opinions about a school event or topic.

Scoreboard – A listing of sports games or matches, the opponent's name, and the final score with a win-loss record.

Scoreboard Design – An attractive and purposeful use of type, shape, line or color that showcases the win/loss record of the season and enhances the spread overall.

Spacing of Elements – Spacing in design is used like punctuation in writing. Tight spacing (less than one pica) between elements is like a period—elements separated by tight space relate to one another. Wide spacing (more than two picas) is like a paragraph return—elements separated by wide space address different topics. A combination of spacing widths creates visual connections and improves the readability of design.

Spread – Two facing pages. Also called a Double Page Spread or DPS.

Unique Idea – A presentation of a topic idea that is not often seen.

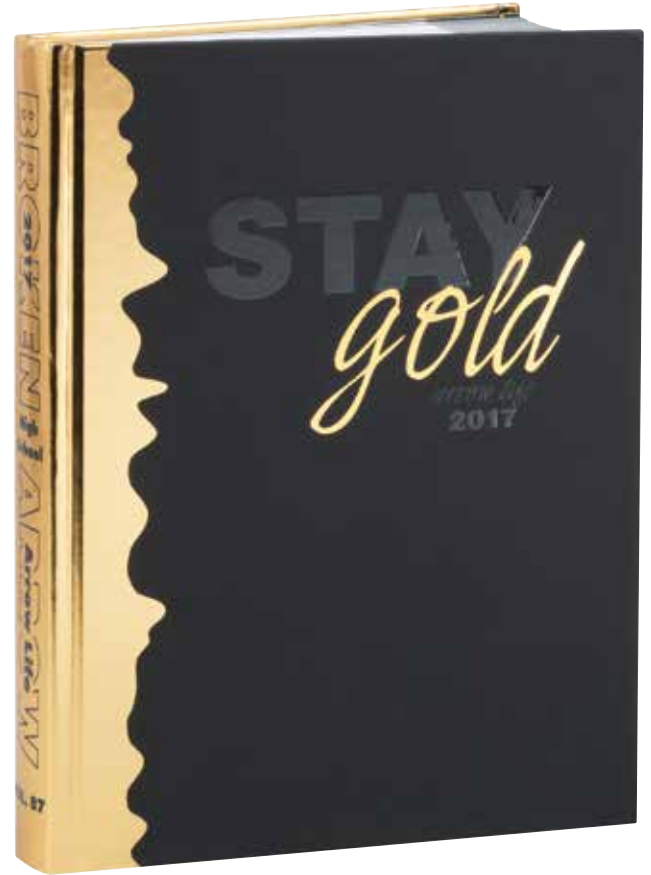

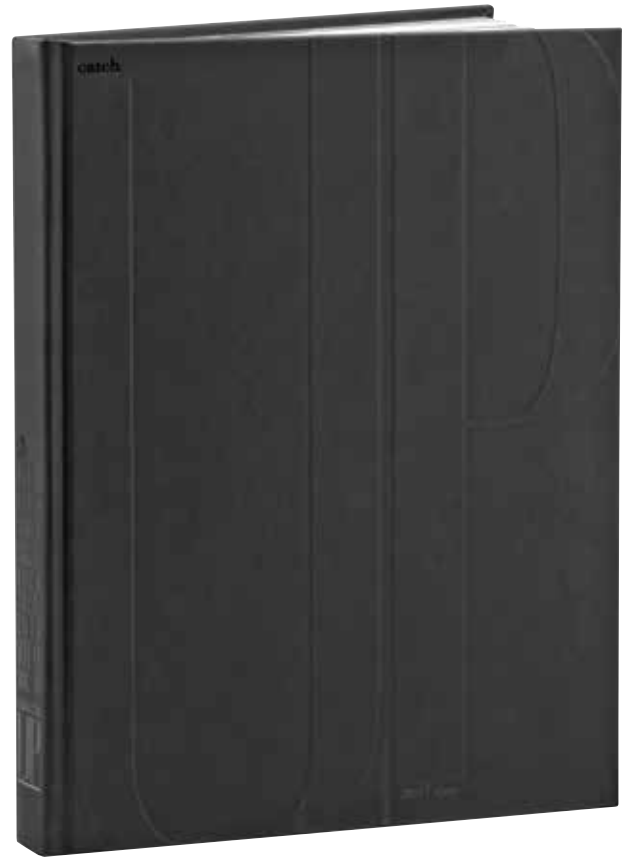

In our 2017 book, we wanted to capture this raw vulnerability and to take a deeper look into each of our students, their strong personalities and unique differences that unite us as “one pack.”

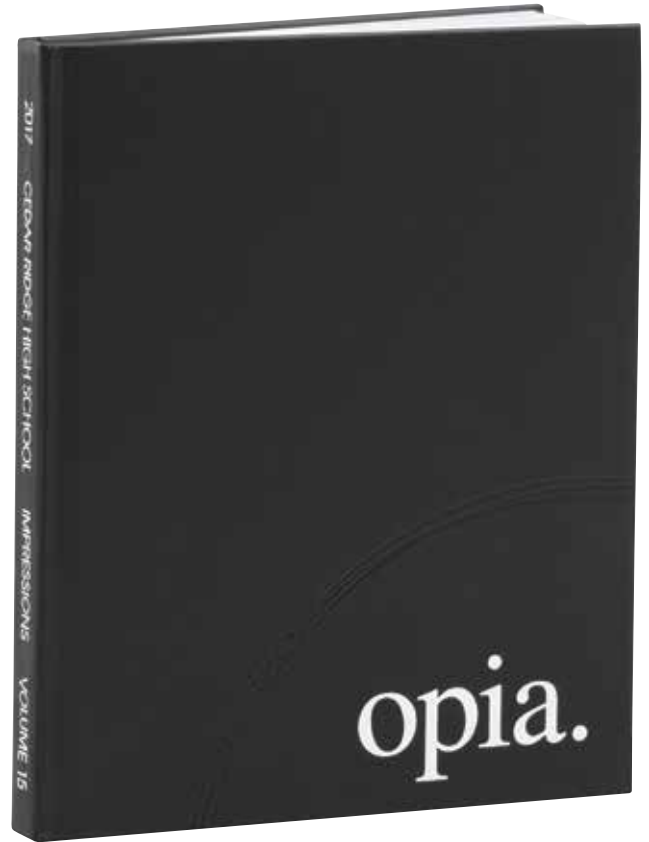

The 23 team members were there as support for the entire band.

"Working with them didn't feel like a job - it felt like I was hanging out with some of my best friends," junior Anna Pflieger said.

Band members said that it wasn't just the hard work on the field that was important to them - the opportunities and memories that each director and member helped create significantly impacted their lives.

"They have shaped the person I am today, and I couldn't imagine having gained that much from any other organization," senior Francesca Williams said.

Seniors said they are proud having helped to create a new tradition of excellence.

"It's very proud to say that this is the product that I put in in my last year at Richardson High School," Crothers said. "I'm really happy that I'm leaving on a good note."

EACH COVER IN THE 2018 *LOOK BOOK* IS TAGGED WITH THE APPLICATIONS USED TO CREATE THAT COVER. WITH OVER 20 APPLICATIONS TO CHOOSE FROM, THE FOLLOWING REPRESENT SOME OF THE COUNTLESS COMBINATIONS AVAILABLE TO MAKE YOUR COVER ONE-OF-A-KIND.

Burnishing – This technique uses high heat to “brand” a cover. The result is a dark rich pattern with a traditional feel.

Cutout Grain – A texture that has been carefully applied to specific areas of a cover but not others.

Debossing – A crisp indented area in the cover surface is created using heat and pressure.

Embossing – A raised effect on the cover surface is created when a die is pressed into the cover board.

Foil – A shiny, untextured, metallic application that can include color or pattern.

Graining – A texture that is pressed into the cover material. 39 patterns are available from wood to leather to alligator.

Lamination – This process makes a litho cover look glossy, matte or super matte.

Litho – Covers that are often colorful and visually intricate. They can include all the detail of a photograph.

Silk-Screening – Color is applied in layers to flat areas of a cover. Screened covers often have large areas of a single color.

Material – Often taking on the look of fabric or leather, materials come in five distinct looks: Aurora, Flax, Natural, Radiance, Regal.

Metalay – Heavy-strength textured metal is affixed to the cover surface – a favorite for medals and crests.





Overtone Rub – Varnish is hand-rubbed onto, and then off of, an embossed cover. The varnish remains trapped in low areas, emphasizing the texture and detail of embossing.

Precision Cut – Using laser technology, designs are cut through the cover to reveal the endsheet.

Quarterbinding – Two materials, often with contrasting colors and textures, are used on the cover. One of the materials wraps around from the back cover onto the front cover, often covering about a quarter of the front lid.

ShineFX – A thick, textured clear-coat is applied to the cover design.

Thermal Ink – Body heat reveals a design or photograph under the black thermal ink.

UV Coating – A thin layer of high gloss for accents, UV Coating is especially effective on photos, type or artwork.

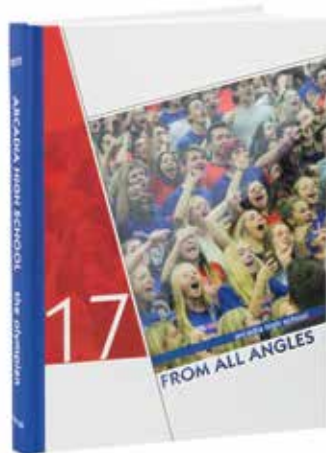

Bird's-Eye View – Stand on a chair, climb a ladder, look down from a balcony. A bird's-eye view allows a photographer to capture unexpected and interesting imagery.

Color Use – Color adds emotional content and can draw attention to a specific area of the photograph. Appropriate use of color in photography adds a dynamic element to images.

Crisp Focus – A crisp image shows detail, but also has a degree of contrast that allows the viewer to notice the detail.

Depth – Otherwise known as deep depth of field, depth is emphasized in a photo that allows the viewer to see crisp detail in the distance or gives a sense of distance.

Emotion – Intense passion is evident in this powerful photographic strategy. Difficult to capture, emotion results in captivating photography.

Fill the Frame – The “frame” refers to the edges of your photo. Get in close, make your subject fill a significant portion of the space within the frame.

Framing – Composing a photo so the subject is surrounded (framed) by content—sky, ground, people—emphasizes the subject.

Height (Peak) of Action – Whether on the field or in the classroom, capturing the top of the jump, the longest stride or the biggest chemistry explosion will result in more interesting photography.

Isolated Subject – A single subject is set apart from the rest of the image. This can be achieved in a variety of ways such as using shallow depth-of-field, lighting, contrasting colors or textures, or limiting the number of subjects.

Implied Leading Lines – A compositional tool in which a person's or animal's gaze leads you to look at something else. Implied leading lines can also be created with repetition in shape, texture or light and shadow.

Leading Lines – A compositional tool in which a literal line connects two subjects or leads the viewer's eye to the subject.

Lighting – Light from the sun or an artificial source that has been used as a primary visual element in a photograph.

Repetition – Shapes and colors that are repeated within the frame yield visual continuity.



Rule of Odds – The rule of odds states that images are more visually appealing when there is an odd number of subjects. For example, if you are going to place more than one person in a photograph, don't use two, use 3 or 5 or 7.

Rule of Thirds – Dividing the image into thirds vertically and horizontally guides the placement of the subject in the frame. Where the lines intersect, visual "hot spots" are created, resulting in a more dynamic composition.

Range of Lights and Darks – A captivating photo often includes darks, light lights and a range of tones in between.

Selective Focus – Otherwise known as shallow depth of field, selective focus is a particularly effective method for emphasizing important elements in the frame.

Silhouette – Created by photographing a subject with the sun behind them, silhouettes can convey drama, mystery, emotion and mood.

Storytelling – The ability of a photograph to tell a rich story, to capture not only a moment in time but also a larger narrative.

Symmetry – Symmetry refers to a line that splits a photo in half and, if both sides of the photo are an exact mirror image of each other, then this object is said to be symmetrical.

Worm's-Eye View – A change in perspective often results in more visually interesting photography. Getting down low, or capturing a worm's-eye view, is one strategy often used by professionals.

"Israel has protected me and my identity for so long. I feel this obligation to serve and protect it like it has protected me."

For as long as she can remember, **Dani Ben-Arie '17** has loved Israel. She grew up with two Israeli parents and spent summer after summer in Israel with her extended family.

"Israel was just kind of the place I went, the place my grandparents lived and I went there in the summers. It was just kind of normal," said Dani.

Keeping with family tradition, Dani and her family visited Israel during the summer of 2016 during Project Protective Edge. There was a huge influx of rockets being fired into the country and Project Protective Edge was initiated to protect the citizens of Israel. The project included the construction of the Iron Dome in Israel, which intercepts and destroys rockets before they can cause harm. It was while visiting family in Israel that summer that Dani would make a decision that would change her life forever.

She was having a normal day with her family—they had decided to visit the zoo. They were wandering around and admiring the animals like any a normal day.

"All the animals started breaking out and we were like 'what's going on?' and then all the wires started going off," said Dani. Rockets were flying towards Israel and Dani and her family were ducking running to the restrooms of the zoo because it was one of the few places in Israel without a local bomb shelter.

"I could hear the whistling noise and I thought 'this is it, I'm dead, I'm dying here.'" No one at the zoo died from that rocket. Dani was able to carry on her visit to Israel safely

because the Iron Dome caught the rocket she thought would end her life. The Iron Dome did more than just save Dani's life. It gave her a new outlook on her future.

"It gave me this moment of clarity where I just realized that the people who had just saved my life are just like me. They're my age, they're people who have a passion for Israel, who are citizens of Israel like I am. That was my first moment of this is what I want to do."

As all her peers were making decisions about colleges, Dani decided to join the Israeli Army, the Israeli Defense Forces, or IDF. As her friends shared their acceptance letters and signed to play Division I sports, Dani visited Florida to meet other American teens who would be joining the IDF with her. Instead of buying a plane ticket for orientation weekend, Dani bought a plane ticket to Israel for Goin' Tzabar, the program that teaches American soldiers Hebrew and absorbs them into the community.

"It has been a really confusing experience, especially when I go to colleges on tours and I think 'oh my god I love this college I could see myself here. I want to go here,' and then realizing that she isn't going to be for another few years. And then also going to colleges and realizing that I am going to be three years older than all the other freshmen." These conflicts, however, have not deterred Dani from her determination to serve Israel.

"Israel has protected me and my identity for so long. I feel this obligation to serve and protect it like it has protected me. It doesn't feel like a choice."

BINDING

Rounded and backed with headbands applied at the top and bottom.

PAPER

The 304 inside pages were printed in process color on 100# Premium Matte [#198]. The Premium Matte paper offers the highest brightness and unparalleled smoothness.

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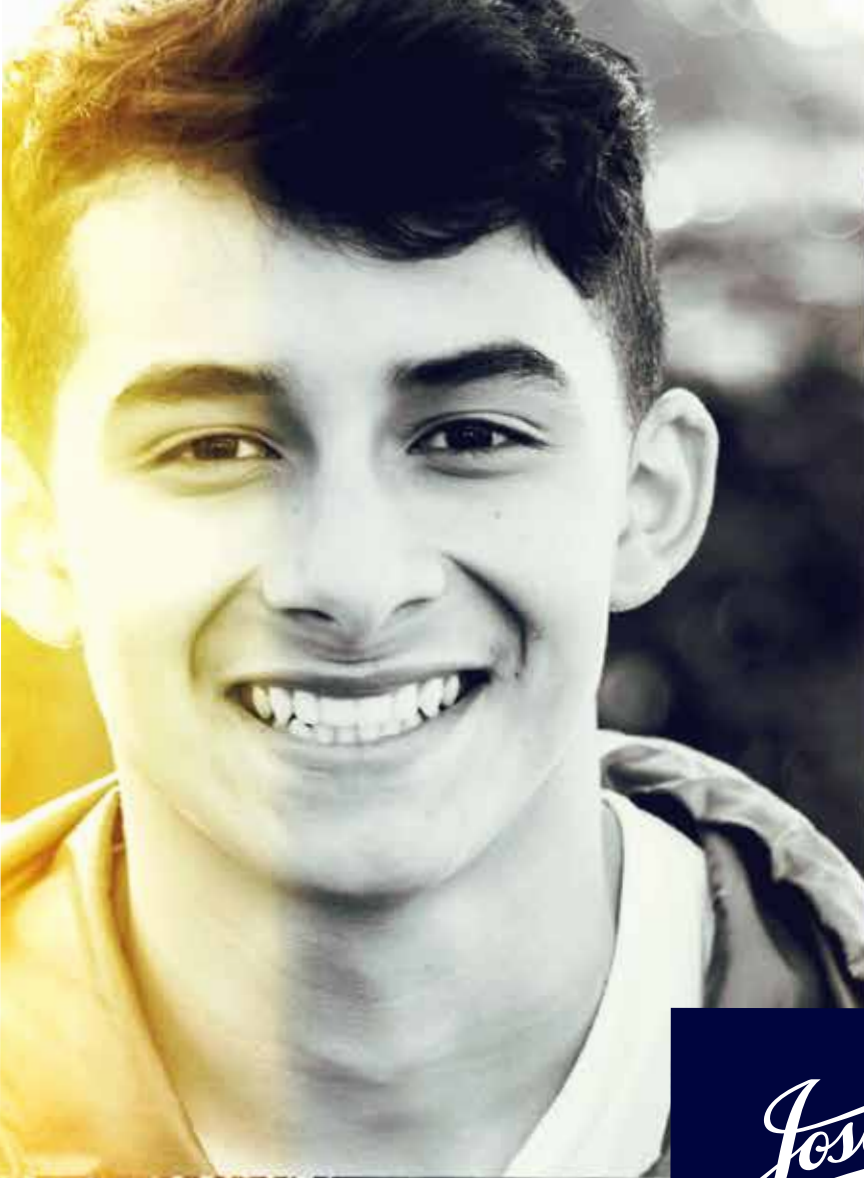
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
